

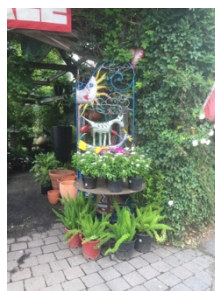
Brunswick Street, Fitzroy
